Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for River Valley Middle High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Patrick Breen, MHS Principal, for assistance.

For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given. Our school has not been given one of these labels by the state.

The data represents some points of pride as well as areas of improvement. We are above state average in 6th grade reading, 11th grade social studies, 11th grade science, and 11<sup>th</sup> grade reading/writing. Challenges are identified as any category or sub-category in which we scored below state average. River Valley Middle/High School challenges include 6th grade mathematics, specifically females; 7th grade mathematics, reading, and females in science; 8th grade mathematics, reading, and males in social studies; 11th grade males in mathematics. We are addressing these challenges with our strategic multi-tiered system of support which includes strategies, including peer mentoring, student-specific action plans and RTI (Response to Intervention) time embedded into the school day, providing 84 minutes of strategic, mandatory support each week. We are also refining our

standard alignment to state and common core standards to impact curriculum. We are in the midst of a transition to standards-based grading to better identify student proficiency on our standards. This will allow us to have a clearer picture of student achievement at the local level in order to have a positive impact on student achievement on the state assessments.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. All Middle High School students in the district automatically attend the district's only Middle high School.
