Dear Families and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2016-17 educational progress for the River Valley Elementary Schools. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

At River Valley Elementary Schools, we are committed to all students' success. Our focus is to do whatever it takes to insure that all students perform with proficiency or higher on all identified Essential Standards in math and ELA. Our staff work and professional learning is always focused on insuring that we offer RITE instruction to all students – Rigorous & Relevant, Integrated, Tech-Infused, and Engaging. Our highest priority is strengthening all instructional practices to best meet the needs of every student. All students experience STEM-based learning throughout the school year as we develop the thinkers and leaders of tomorrow. All classrooms provide strong systems of support for all students through the use of Student Data Notebooks as we set goals with students and monitor their growth as they work toward that goal. We implement building-wide Strategy Groups in math and reading, focused on

meeting each child where they are helping them grow. Any student not performing at grade level in reading or math has an Intervention Plan in place that specifically addresses their strengths and weakness, with research-based interventions intended to bring accelerated growth. We are committed to the development of the whole child through our Music & PE Program and our Art Studio, and continue to develop Positive Behavior Systems as we work towards a strong and healthy school culture for all students and staff. We are committed to partnering with our community through our WATCH DOGS program, Lunch Buddies, classroom volunteers, and a variety of field trips.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

Students are assigned to buildings by grade level. Kindergarten through 2nd grade are housed at our Chikaming campus and Grades 3rd-5th are housed at the Three Oaks campus.

Our current School Improvement Plan is used as the framework for our work throughout the school year. This plan is in the implementation phase. The plan is reviewed and updated annually.

River Valley Elementary Schools do not operate specialized schools.

The elementary core curriculum can be found by going to the following site: www.mi.gov/mde. Each teacher is expected to follow these guidelines and there are no known variances.

River Valley Elementary Schools consistently has a 100% attendance at parent/teacher conferences, both fall and winter, for all grade levels.

River Valley Elementary schools uses AIMSweb k-5 three times per school year. It is an assessment system designed to assess all students' progress. At the conclusion of the 16-17 school year the following percentages of students were at or above benchmark: Kindergarten 54%; 1st grade 75%; 2nd grade 48%; 3rd grade 30%; 4th grade 19%; 5th grade 42%. At the mid-year benchmark of the 17-18 school year the following percentages of students were at or above benchmark: Kindergarten -76%; 1st - 64%; 2nd - 54%; 3rd - 69%; 4th - 41%; 5th - 39%.

We continue to be proud of the progress of our school and are always striving to improve, toward our goal of Success, Nothing Less! In order to continue toward excellence, we must work together - school, home and community - towards greatness for our students. Thank you doing your part to make River Valley Elementary a great place to be!
